From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Emmanuel Friedens Friends,

Many years ago Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. placed in our consciousness words from an even earlier day. In the years before the Civil War, Theodore Parker, a Unitarian minister and abolitionist preacher who before the Civil War gave voice to the struggle to abolish slavery and liberate those in its bonds, had preached: "I do not pretend to understand the moral universe, the arc is a long one, my eye reaches but little ways. I cannot calculate the curve and complete the figure by the experience of sight; I can divine it by conscience. But from what I see I am sure it bends towards justice." More than a century later, picking up the struggle for racial justice, and uttering the words in the context of a new day, Dr. King spoke again and with fresh conviction: "The arc of the moral universe is long, but it bends toward justice."

The word "Advent" means simply **Beginning**. For many of us, because Advent concludes with Christmas day, the word suggests simply the season of expectation and preparation for the Christmas holiday. And yet the **beginning** to which the word Advent refers has a broader meaning as well. Advent is a season of expectation and longing: the **longing** we have as people of faith for a day when ancient injustice has been put right; the **expectation** that by the grace of God, and the struggle of people of good will, the world will somehow at last be healed of the fear and violence that so often dominate human affairs.

As we engage Advent of 2015, to claim that we are in a time of fresh beginnings may take a fresh decision of faith. To insist publicly that there even *is* a moral arc to the universe requires both clarity of conscience and the ability to glimpse light even "just before midnight."

Recently some of us joined with members of Emmanuel Baptist Church in a Saturday together for "faithing up to racism." We acknowledged that each of us has at some time or another in our personal journey has encountered the institutional realities of racism. More than half a century after Dr. King was assassinated, the realities of structural injustice and violence against the most vulnerable continue. And even as we soberly consider the work left to be done in regard to racism, so many other recent events may also tempt us to abandon any sense of an advent of a new era of justice and mercy among humans.

So we need this season, this year, to reclaim our convictions, and to strengthen one another in conscience and faith. We need it not simply to prepare for the joy of a Christmas holiday, but also to rediscover our personal roadmaps into God's uncertain future. We need it, if we are to reclaim the profound hope that together God and humanity will indeed someday turn things around.

I invite you to join us this week and in the weeks to come, as we light candles in the night. May we together rekindle the flame, not of naïve optimism, but of persistent Hope. May we seek and share a little light for the sake of Christ's Peace, rooted in justice. May we insist together on the shining star of Joy. And may we once more reflect the bright deep light of Love, flickering here and there where it is least seen and most needed.

Music Notes and Announcements

We welcome Michael Harrison, our new Minister of Music, who began working at our church in November. Michael Harrison is a native of Scotia who has recently moved back to this area from Nashville, TN. He currently resides in Saratoga Springs. He earned degrees in music theory from SUNY Albany and choral conducting at the University of Iowa, and also did doctoral studies in historical performance practice at Washington University in St. Louis and choral music at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

For many years, Michael was a part-time professional chorister in Washington, D.C. He sang in several professional church choirs as well as with some of the best chamber choirs in the D.C. area. He founded the Palestrina Choir of Washington, D.C. in 1986 and directed it until 2006. The Washington Post called it "unquestionably one of the finest choral groups in our area." Michael also composes, and his choral works have been performed by a variety of church, community and college choirs throughout the country, including locally by the Albany Pro Musica and, coming up this December 19th, by the Auriel Camerata at the Immaculate Conception Church in Glenville.

Michael is divorced and has one daughter, Hannah, who is a freshman at Mount Holyoke College. When not doing things musical, he spends time reading (fiction, and non-fiction on an eclectic range of subjects) and enjoys walking to downtown Saratoga Springs to visit the library and the book stores. During the warmer months he spends as much time as he can at Galway Lake, where his family has had a camp for fifty years.

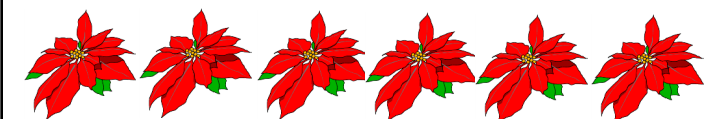
